Facts about Bed Bugs

Bed bugs are insect parasites that feed on blood. And the most common bed bug *Cimex lectularius* prefers human blood. Although bed bugs can feed at anytime, most are active at night generally biting their unsuspecting human hosts just before dawn at around 5am. Although bites can go undetectable, a number of adverse health effects may result from bed bug bites including allergic reactions, rashes, prominent blisters and psychological effects. Bites may develop slowly into low itchy welts that can take weeks to go away. Scars can result from scratching bites.

Furthermore, Bed bugs can harbor human diseases in their bodies like bubonic plague and hepatitis B. Adult bed bugs can live for as long as a year without feeding with enough air moisture in the air.

Female bedbugs lay up to five eggs in a day and five hundred during a lifetime. Low infestations are difficult to detect, and most victims don't even realize they have bedbugs until the infestation is completely out of control.

How do dwellings become infested with bed bugs?

Bugs and eggs are inadvertently brought in from other infested dwellings by visiting pets; a person's clothing or baggage. Infested items such as used clothing, and infested second-hand furniture (dressers, mattresses, chairs). Wild animals (such as bats or birds) harbor bed bugs.

Experts believe that bed bug infestations have been on the rise due to increased domestic and international travel where people are susceptible to bed bugs at hotels, motels, and bed-and-breakfasts.

Bed bugs are easily capable of moving through cracks and crevices of walls. Bedbugs migrate between units in multi-unit dwellings like condos, hotels and apartments through ducts and ceilings.
